- [Planning Search – Herefordshire Council](#) – P223397/F – Little Hundred, Middleton on the Hill - Proposed change of use of land from agriculture to garden and retrospective creation of a new vehicular access (part retrospective) – Awaiting decision. – Comments have already been made.
- [Planning Search – Herefordshire Council](#) – P224134/F – Orchard House Middleton on the Hill - The erection of a new building of the same size and profile and on the same site as a recently collapsed building for use as a holiday let (part retrospective) – Awaiting decision. – This is the 2nd application for the holiday let. More information has been provided, however the Parish Council comments on the original application have not been answered, so it was decided to submit the same comments on the application regarding whether the holiday let footprint is the same as the original barn. There are no scale on drawing to show the size of the original building and the holiday let.
