

Starting from the Church

Walk No. 1

Have a look at the church and churchyard. On a clear day you can see beautiful views across Leominster to the Black Mountains.

On leaving the churchyard cross the lane to a stile next to a gate. Go over the stile. The footpath follows the hedge on your right across three fields to a brook.

Turn left at the brook and follow it for about three hundred yards until you reach a footbridge. Cross the bridge and turn left again.

Keeping the brook on your left cross two fields using the stiles. Then you will reach a rough area of ground with a marshy copse on your right. The trees here have been coppiced, and in the early summer there are yellow iris and kingcups flowering in the marsh.

Go through the gate onto a lane. Turn right for a few yards to see the stone steps leading down to the stream where water used to be drawn.

Retrace your steps and continue up a narrow lane with high banks on either side. In spring these banks have primroses and violets and many other wild flowers. In a short while you will be back at the church.

Approx. 1 mile.

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Walk No. 2

On leaving the churchyard cross the lane to a stile next to a gate. Go over the stile. The footpath follows the hedge on your right across three fields to a brook.

Turn right at the brook and continue with the stream on your left over two fields and stiles. Ahead of you is a distinct dip in the field leading to a sunken green track which goes away to the right.

Go along the track, through a gate and continue until you reach another gate. Here there is a tall timber-framed house on your left, and a brick and stone barn on your right.

Go through the gate and past the barn onto a lane. Turn right and follow this lane for about 300 yards until you reach a crossroads. At the crossroads take the right turn, and then turn right again at the next junction. In a short while you will be back at the church.

Approx. 1 mile.
