


EARL HAIGH FUND POPPY COLLECTION 2021 HAMNISH AND KIMBOLTON

STAYING SAFE IN OUR COMMUNITIES

There are many advantages to living in rural areas but access to help in an emergency can be a worry. In recent years defibrillators have appeared in some places, but not everyone is clear about how they work and to whom we should turn in a crisis.



Mark Raybould, who lives in Middleton-on-the-Hill has many years' experience of responding to emergency situations, as a volunteer Community First Responder with South East Coast Ambulance Service in Kent. Having passed assessments with West Midlands Ambulance Service he hopes to be back serving the community in the local area soon.

Mark is also a Heart Start course instructor, teaching basic life-saving skills to members of the public to include; recognising the difference between a heart attack and a cardiac arrest, delivering cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) to a patient in arrest, and how to use a defibrillator and place someone in a recovery position once breathing. He told us:

"If someone has a heart attack or cardiac arrest, the first thing to do is always ring 999, and the operator will talk you through what to do next. 30,000 'out of hospital' cardiac arrests occur each year and of these only one in ten survive, largely because bystanders are not sure what to do and so do nothing".

"If the person is in cardiac arrest you need to do Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation. It is always better to do something, your actions could buy time until the professional Paramedic teams get there. If there is another person present they can fetch a community defibrillator, guided by the 999 operator. Each one gives easy to follow, step by step instructions and action could save a life."

We have three defibrillators currently in our 'Roundabout' area...at the back of the Stockton Cross Inn, Kimbolton, on Leysters Village Hall and Bockleton Village Hall. These have been provided through community fundraising, and are the responsibility of that community. They should be checked regularly, and each one should have a named guardian making sure they are in good working order. All of them should be registered with the Ambulance Service so that they are aware of their existence and can guide a member of the community to them quickly.

A defibrillator could be the difference between life and death.

BAKING A TRADITIONAL SIMNEL CAKE

If you love winter baking, what about planning a traditional Simnel cake for this Easter?

In Herefordshire and Shropshire the 17th Century tradition of apprentices and domestic servants taking a cake home on Mothering Sunday is still celebrated in our parishes on the 4th Sunday of Lent when a cake is shared at the end of the morning service.

This cake is known as a 'Simnel Cake' following the 1869 recipe from the 'Chamber's Book of Days'.

It contains dried fruit with a layer of marzipan on top and within. It is decorated with eleven marzipan balls each represents one of the eleven Apostles (without Judas). This religious symbolism goes back to medieval times.

At the end of Lent food stocks would have been running short, so this traditional gift of a Simnel cake would have been a very special gift on Mothering Sunday.

OUR LOCAL HISTORY

From the outset we planned to include items about our local history in Roundabout, that new members of the community might find interesting. If you have researched any part of your village or home and would like to share it, do get in touch.

BACHE CAMP

The oldest evidence of community life in our parishes dates back to the Iron Age – in the 1st millennium BC. The remaining earthwork at Bache Camp is one of several still to be found in north west Herefordshire. These 'hillforts' are the most visual remains that survive here from prehistory.

The main oval earthwork encloses six acres with an entrance to the south. Archaeologists estimate that it could have contained about 125 dwellings .It is unclear why these forts were built but it would have taken a huge amount of effort to construct the earthen banks and the ditch that surrounds the enclosure.

There is archaeological evidence of small granaries to store grain inside the enclosure. This would suggest that the people of that time had started to lead more settled lives managing the surrounding area to grow corn in field enclosures but retreating into the safety of the fort when violence threatened.

Hillforts had a wide range of roles. They were communal centres or domestic settlements for a whole community, a place of defence and a refuge in times of unrest as well as a meeting place for trade.

Other forts in the area such as those at Ivington, Risbury and Croft Ambrey are larger but Bache Camp remains very much part of our early history before the Roman Conquest bought significant changes to a tribal way of life.


