

IT'S GOOD....OFSTED GIVES THE THUMBS UP TO KIMBOLTON SCHOOL

Good news this week, OFSTED 'dropped in' to inspect Kimbolton, St. James' CE Primary School and after a rigorous examination renewed their 'GOOD' status with an excellent report.

Executive Head Teacher Adam Breakwell shared some of their comments:

"'Be the best I can be' is a frequently heard statement from both staff and pupils. It goes beyond a statement.

Pupils behave well. They enjoy school and are proud to work and learn together. Parents and carers value the family and community spirit.

Staff know the pupils well across the school. Strong, nurturing relationships, alongside high expectations, ensure that all pupils, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND), achieve well.

Pupils know about different forms of bullying. They say it sometimes happens but adults sort it. Pupils spoke highly of the care all staff give them and feel safe. They appreciate that they can talk to adults in school about their feelings. Pupils embrace and fully participate in school life and beyond, for example through the student council, gardening club and a range of fundraising activities. Pupils understand and show respect, especially within the school's Christian values. However, pupils' understanding of some fundamental British values is less well developed.

Animals are a unique part of the school. Pupils love chatting to the goats at playtime. A cat checks in on lessons. Pupils choose to share their unusual reading places, from the back of a pony or in the sheep pen."

Head of School Charlotte Hyde added:

"Since September the new Reception children and their families have been welcomed to the Kimbolton family and I am very pleased to say that they have had a wonderful start to the school year! They've been busy exploring the environment, making new friends and learning the routines. They're settling into school brilliantly. We also welcomed Mrs Sara Smith to the Reception teaching team



We are welcoming visits from families interested in the school for September 2023 intake. Please contact the school directly on 01568 612691 if you would like a personal tour of the school.

Staff have been busy learning new skills themselves with the introduction of a new Phonics scheme and approach to writing. In the coming months, you will see and hear children becoming fantastic storytellers throughout the school. CRAFTY CHRISTMAS MUST INCLUDE STITCHES

What you might not know about one local business!

If you are walking along High Street in Leominster you can't miss Stitches, the handicraft emporium that has been, and is now more than ever, a part of creative life in our communities. The ancient building (no. 2) is itself fascinating, having been the home of renowned artist John Scarlett Davis (1804) (see blue plaque), and a licensed venue for singing and dancing. And it is thought to have medieval connections to the Priory too.



The business is owned by Liz Watkins, who lives in The Hundred. She took it on when it was in trouble and in 1992 she and her husband moved it to Draper's Lane and subsequently to High Street where there are two floors of wools, fabrics, haberdashery and just about everything else that a crafter could need. She employs seven staff as well as a team making curtains and soft furnishings.

"It was originally a sewing shop, she told us, but although I don't knit we have expanded to house a vast collection of wools too. People come from miles and are amazed at our scope and range."
