WELCOME

Where to start? So much news this time, and your Coronation pictures in colour. So many events were held in honour of King Charles 111, Bockleton and Hampton Charles lunched and planted trees, Hamnish had a BBQ, Kimbolton a picnic and a garage party, and the combined service at Pudleston was fit for a king.

So, no time to waste.

And talking of waste, the first story is all about our water.

Whilst local volunteers have spent the year testing water quality in the River Lugg, one of them, Bryony John from Middleton-on-the-Hill, has also been badgering Welsh Water to do something about the water main there that has been bursting and flooding the area on a regular basis.

She told us, "We had an old asbestos main and the high pressure coming from our water supply in Knightwick was causing it to split, flooding the fields".

After endless repairs, Bryony was delighted that her persistence paid off, and Welsh Water decided to replace the main completely, which took six weeks and cost hundreds of thousands of pounds.

As well as pipes, water quality is currently a hot topic across Herefordshire.

Happily new initiatives on the Lugg and Wye are supplying important data and Severn Trent Water is now using the River Teme as their study project to find ways to improve water quality. And, it seems, we too can help.

One of our new advertisers Charles Maiden Waste Disposal, based in Bromyard, explains the regulations and requirements surrounding septic tanks and treatment plants.



Hot topic. Plaques like these have appeared in our area.

"The Environment Agency brought out a set of Regulations out in 2015 which came into force in 2020. Their aim is to ensure all domestic sewage systems are emptied and maintained on an annual basis based, on a standard domestic dwelling with one average family."

"This is to reduce the risk of pollution both to land or watercourse which often happens when septic tanks and treatment plants are not maintained by a good regime of emptying and servicing."

"We support these regulations and have been encouraging customers who may have previously neglected a regular emptying regime."

"Less frequent maintenance can cause irreversible damage to your sewage system, and getting the system back to an acceptable level of compliance can be costly. As well as septic tanks, a sewage treatment plant also needs a service annually."

Lastly, on our water theme, toilet paper is amongst the top five 'eco crimes' according to the New Scientist, as much of it is still produced from virgin wood and plastic. Local entrepreneur David Hamlet is one of those producing a glue and plastic free roll, which dissolves rapidly and is ideal for septic tanks boats and caravans. "Our TANKI toilet paper was developed in the maritime industry as on boats, blockages and clogging are a real issue."



"Sustainable toilet paper helps us to save water too".

Sustainable toilet rolls are available in a growing number of local shops and online, and they are cheaper if you subscribe.

LEYSTERS' AMBITIOUS PLAN

Residents in Leysters have set out on the giant task of raising money to restore the 200 year old organ at St Andrews' Church.

The Parochial Church Council needs to raise £18,000 to repair it professionally and keep it in use for services.

"We are a small parish," said PCC secretary Mrs Amanda Griffiths. "It's a lot of money for a small village, so we are reaching out for help from the wider community, who often enjoy our services as visitors."

A professional expert, Dr James Berrow, reported to the PCC that "this little instrument will yield many of its secrets when it is dismantled and carefully examined". He credited the five-stop, one-manual organ to Worcester maker John Nicholson, but it was already second hand when installed at Leysters in 1890.

"The organ is worthy of restoration" he concluded. "This would add to the 132 years it has already served at Leysters with an earlier life of another 40–50 years – a green musical instrument."

An Open Garden and Scarecrow Trail event on Sunday May 28th and an auction at The Duke of York pub, will be followed by lots more fun events.


