THREADS THROUGH CREATION

From 5th June to 18th July Leominster Priory and surrounding villages

Rob Walker, stained-glass window expert and Reader at Kimbolton and Hamnish, recently gave a talk about the windows at Hamnish Church. He is a key member of the 'Threads through Creation' team which has designed a wide variety of activities, including concerts, talks and themed village walks, and craft sessions alongside the exhibition.

'Threads through Creation' involves our whole team of local churches, including the Eastern Parishes. There is a 'Village Creation Trail', designed by Rob Walker encouraging visitors to the main exhibition to explore the treasures and creative projects in local churches. A comprehensive leaflet and map is available to download from Priory Arts.

St Andrew's Church Leysters has their own 'Lovely Leysters' Exhibition, with a display of hand-made decorated kneelers and blankets, knitted in the colours of the flag of St Andrew, as well as photos and paintings of lovely Leysters.

All proceeds to their organ fund.

And finally local schools have been preparing artwork to display in the Norman Nave of the Priory as part of a community exhibition. They will visit the Priory to take part in music, dance and craft workshops as they visit the exhibition. Kimbolton School will be walking there, enjoying the natural world on the way.

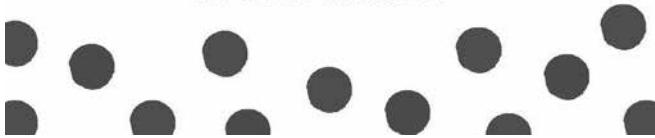

I'm sure everyone will agree they have kept our church in lovely condition".

SPARE A THOUGHT FOR OUR FARMERS

By any yardstick it's been a wet winter...all eight months of it! Annoying for most but devastating for our neighbours who farm the land...and face the ever challenges of keeping food on our tables. It's hard work, it's dangerous and it has been pretty disheartening of late.

Bill and Nicky Smith have farmed here all their lives. Bill was born in Middleton-on-the Hill and went to Kimbolton school. He followed his father into farming and a couple of years ago said in this magazine " I love it". We asked them how the winter affected their business.



"Wow!

"You could say the weather has been extremely extreme," they said.

"We are currently delivering last year's potatoes to the factory. Last year's growing season actually suited the crop and subsequently produced good yields of good quality potatoes. However, once the autumn arrived, along came the rain. This meant we were working with very wet soils, which slowed harvesting progress to a water snail's pace. The resulting extra costs in both monetary terms and human effort required were enormous."

“In addition the cereal crops that we planted became waterlogged and some of them struggled to cope. You can see many fields with bare patches in them and so we are not expecting a bumper yield from these fields.”

As we write, the sun has reappeared and we are busy planting this year’s crop of potatoes. The conditions are good and we are optimistic that we will have a good crop and wishing for an easier harvest with less extreme weather.”

Ed Rollings, who rears sheep and cattle at Perry Wood Farm also has farming heritage in these parts and returned to the land after a career in the easy world of commerce!

“Winter has been long and tough. You expect bad weather but when it has been as incessant as it has been between October and March it can be demoralising. We lamb outside in April, with hope of warmer weather and the grass will be growing. As April approached there was no sign of kinder weather. The busy first two weeks of lambing were no better. You have to trust your sheep and the system but it is mentally wearing. Losses were not too bad but every problem felt bigger than it was and trying to catch a ewe whilst not going arse over... well...”

“Those that lamb earlier than I do (usually inside) perhaps had it worse. Schmallenberg virus raised its ugly head again this year and I’ve heard horror stories of 30–40% losses in some flocks. It must have been awful knowing each time you turned the lights on the shed to check your ewes, you’d be facing that each day.”

“Although it’s been hard there is little time to dwell on what’s passed, as there are seasonal jobs to move on to. So you play the hand you’ve been dealt and hope again that better times come.”

Ed also finds time to be Chairman of the Kimbolton and Hamnish Parish Council and to advertise loyally in Roundabout. His details are on our back cover.



NEW LOCAL WILDLIFE GROUP OFF TO A GOOD START

As the new branch of the Herefordshire Wildlife Trust was formed to serve Leominster, Bromyard and the surrounding villages, they were delighted that people from around North Herefordshire packed out the hall recently to hear Andrew McRobb of Herefordshire CPRE talk about rivers. They told us:

“The Wye now has a River Champion, Angela McIntyre (unpaid!) who may be able to get the various authorities responsible for the River Wye system to work together for improvements in water quality.”

“Welsh Water will continue to invest in infrastructure to reduce sewage run-off. More people are taking part in ‘Citizen Science’ river sampling, which is providing data on the watercourses including the River Lugg, although they cannot replace the Environmental Agency, which is hampered by lack of funding and only has six inspectors in the area.”

So, if you are inspired by National Volunteering week, maybe you would like to be a wildlife champion or a village liaison?

A talk on Wildlife Gardening, July 11th will be followed by visits and workshops.

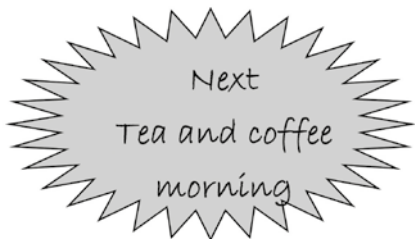
