WELCOME

It's harvest time...well sort of...harvest has been a bit on and off this year and overall not great. Still, we shall celebrate our bounty as ever with our Harvest Festivals. We have lots of other events coming up too and hear about the new term at our school. Also this month Jackie Duggan is doing her 600 mile ride for the Midlands Air Ambulance (in the last edition), so if you haven't sponsored her yet, there is still time.

But first, to our latest farming story. We were delighted to hear from Paul Phillips whose farming business is firmly focussed on the future and the challenges of feeding a growing population.

KIMBOLTON BREEDER TAKES TOP HONOURS AT TENBURY SHOW

The Kimbolton flock of pedigree Texels were on top form at Tenbury Show this year, winning Champion Texel with a shearling ram, despite some very strong competition.

The fifty strong ewe flock is run by Paul Phillips who has been building a reputation for producing high performing genetics that are sold to breeders from all over the UK as well as being exported internationally.

He told us: "In today's agricultural industry, efficiency is key, particularly as the UK's national flock is around thirty two million sheep."

"One of the simplest things that can be done is to use the best possible genetics, as this can enhance animal welfare, boost lamb production, and help reduce emissions contributing to overall sustainability."

"For nearly two decades we have been meticulously developing the flock. We collect large amounts of data on the animals, including CT scanning significant lambs, and select for key traits. We have participated in research covering mastitis and foot rot, improving meat eating quality and meat yield, and now research is beginning to help identify animals who emit less CO2e."

"All our data, including DNA information, is integrated into comprehensive genomic evaluations managed by the Texel Sheep Society. These provide highly accurate breeding values and rankings, placing Kimbolton sheep consistently in the top 1% of the breed. Online publishing allows potential buyers anywhere in the world to identify animals who have the superior genetics they are looking for".

"Recent disease challenges such as Schmallenberg, and now Bluetongue are real concerns. Bluetongue has seen mortality of up to 75% in Holland in unvaccinated flocks and is carried by midges. I am waiting to find out when vaccine will be available, as this will help reduce losses. However the arrival of Bluetongue in the UK has also meant export markets are closed for the foreseeable future, so there is a significant welfare and financial cost, which is a worry"

Despite these challenges, Paul remains hopeful about the future of Kimbolton genetics, confident that the flock will continue to play a pivotal role in advancing the British sheep industry and he is looking forward to competing again at next year's Tenbury Show.

MORE THAN 70 YEARS OF LOCAL CRICKET

In 1948 the Kimbolton Cricket Team played its first match in Harley Jones's field at New House Farm.

It was the beginning of an illustrious sporting era for Kimbolton.

Under the chairmanship of the Reverend Herbert Thomas the team collected silver ware from the Orelton and Leominster Leagues culminating in a brilliant tour of South Devon playing matches at Paignton and Babacombe in 1952.

Matches were played at the Grange in Leominster, Dales' ground, Leysters and Hollybrook Hamnish, where the vice chairman John Pitts built a pavilion. Roberta Hodnet remembers keeping the score sheets with Barbara Bird and Freda Lloyd.

Over the years many men and lads from Kimbolton played and ladies provided countless teas. Committee meetings were always held at the Stockton Cross where Jack Lewis, Geoffrey Morris and Keith Hodnet continued to meet together for fifty years afterwards on a Saturday night.

The photograph on our inside front cover was taken in 1955. If anyone can identify the 4th from the left in the back row do get in touch.

The match was won by Kimbolton who snatched victory in an exciting match that swung back and forth between the two teams. The winning runs scored by Graeme Murray-Shirreff with only 4 balls remaining!

An amazing £1000 was raised for the local Parkinson's Society and £500 for research in the West Midlands. Dr Duncan Jones , the Herefordshire treasurer, and Mr Adrian Marshall chair of Herefordshire's Parkinson's support , both expressed their very grateful thanks.




